Skiing is a sport or a recreational activity that would certainly and inevitably subject you to injuries and emergency situations, so expect the unexpected and learn the fundamentals and safety and contingency measures and practices.
- Know your limitations. If you have permanent knee injuries or disabilities, acknowledge them humbly and honestly. If those shortcomings could prevent you from skiing, so be it. It would be better to just let it go than risk your life just to try skiing out.
- Invest in safe and reliable skiing equipment. Before using those ski tools and materials, always make sure they are in good and excellent condition. Of course, you would not want to be stuck somewhere in the middle of the snow-capped hills just because the ski equipment suddenly broke or malfunctioned along the way.
- If you are not yet familiar with the activity, always make sure the equipment is checked by an expert before wearing them. Also, if possible, ski with an expert or a familiarized and skilled skier with you so you know you would still be safe while in the arduous process of getting used to skiing.

Getting Geared Up For Skiing

Skiing is becoming more and more popular as a sports event or as a recreational activity or hobby for various kinds of people, in all walks of life, throughout the world. That is why, just like in other sports and hobbies, people really go out and invest significant amount of money buying equipment and apparel necessary to get into the tedious and challenging physical activity.

There are various shops in the United States, in Canada and elsewhere in the world that offer and distribute different and branded equipment and apparel necessary and required for skiing.

It is to be noted that skiing apparel and equipment are to be bought and collected before finally attempting to get into the activity. That is because safety and functionality are ensured by these apparel and equipment.

Skiing can be a dangerous and sometimes, life-threatening activity so care should be exercised at all times and safety instructions adhered to. However, there are still many people interested and hooked into skiing. It can at times be appropriate to tag these people as dare devils because of the guts and nerve they exhibit upon performing skiing tasks and skills.

Necessary Apparel

The following the most necessary and must-have apparels that one must first secure and own before getting into skiing. These are available conveniently at various sports and leisure shops in countries where it is possible for people to ski.

- Ski. This is an equipment that makes skiing really possible. The ski is designed to be worn at the feet, and attached or bound to the ski boots. The

ski works by producing friction between the snow and the sole so the heat generated would melt the snow a little. Thus, gliding easily, conveniently and rapidly is made possible.

- **Ski boots.** As mentioned earlier, ski boots are the foot apparels that should be worn by the skier when skiing. This apparel is made up of pure and original leather, on top of a strong, firm and very thick shoe soles. The design of this foot apparel would protect the feet from excruciating cold.
- **Ski binding.** This apparel attaches the ski boots to the ski. Thus, the ski is made almost like an extension of the ski boots, making out for a smooth and hassle-free movement while gliding.
- **Ski suit** is just as important as the ski boots and the ski. It is imperative that you avoid skiing in your usual casual wear or even your fashionable jacket or other winter apparel. Ski suits are made up of very fine and appropriate materials that would protect your frail body from the harsh freezing temperature while skiing. Definitely a must have.
- **Ski poles** are the sticks similar to the ancient walking sticks. Ski poles improve the skier's acceleration, balance and of course speed.
- **Sun glasses** are apparels that would protect your eyes from extreme light. Remember, sunlight can be reflected from the snow, and at times even magnified twice. So protect your eyes with dark-colored eye or sun glasses to prevent eye injury, and possibly skiing accidents.
- **Other necessary apparels** are the ski gloves, which protect the hands from cold while holding the ski poles, and the ski wax, which is applied directly into the bottom or sole of the ski to help the equipment glide smoothly and hassle-free in snow.

Overall, apparels used in skiing are must have investments that you, the skier, or the wannabe skier, must first get a hold of before getting into the extreme activity.

Top Skiing Holiday Destinations In The USA

Aspen

Alta

Among the skiers, Alta in Utah has reached a cult-like popularity. It's a little over half an hour's trip from the Salt Lake City airport, making it more accessible for people with limited time. Alta is known for its incomparable intermediate slopes, making it a choice for professionals and beginners alike.

California

California has countless breathtakingly beautiful areas for skiing professionals and enthusiasts. This is particularly true for the area intersected by the California-Nevada border. During n winter, sunny California days often produce low temperatures at night.

Wyoming

There are several ski resorts in Wyoming enough to quench your thirst for skiing holidays. Particularly beautiful are resorts located in the Teton village. The magnificent Teton mountain range has been blessed some vertical slopes reaching some 4,000 feet.

Aside from the slopes, Teton is teeming with scenery which only nature can create, like moose, coyotes, and elks. Should you want some diversion, the Yellowstone National Park is near.

Sun Valley, Idaho

One ski resort that is visited also by film and political celebrities is Sun Valley, located in Idaho. Averell Harriman, president of the Union Pacific Railway, built this resort. Historical notes say that Harriman's purpose for creating this resort was to attract passengers during winter, to keep his business profitable.

Taos, New Mexico

An out of the ordinary mixture from different cultures makes this ski resort the destination of choice for those who are looking for something different from the myriad of snow-covered ski places in the US. Your skiing holidays will definitely have fun a twist in this place.

It offers a good number of steep slopes and also easy slopes for those who are just starting to ski. Ernie Blake, a former interrogator for Allied Intelligence during WWII, was considered as the creator of this fantastic ski resort. He reportedly invited the well known Mayer bothers to help in running the ski school.

Skiing In Austria

The world famous home of skiing, Austria, is an ideal resort for anyone who enjoys skiing. The fresh alpine slopes, combined with picture-postcard scenery, and a grand culture of centuries old make Austria an ideal holiday destination, whether or not you simply adore skiing like me!

Austria is home to a wide variety of ski resorts, catering for all abilities and tastes. From the lavishly expensive to the bargain basement (yet still of a consistently high quality), Austria has it all, from the highest peaks, to the snowiest landscapes, and with a bit of research you can find some really great deals.

When in Austria, you'd be mad not to ski the alps. The dream of many skiers, the alps span several European countries, and is a must-ski for an enthusiast. Spend a good few days in Austria, and dedicate at least one of them to skiing the alps. You won't regret it, I can promise you that!

If you put in the research work before you leave, you will generally be able to find some top quality accommodation at low prices. Whether you are booking within a ski resort, or nearby, you should consult the internet to find last minute deals which might help you save money. A good tip to bear in mind is that the star rating given to accommodation does not indicate quality. You might be better off in a one star than a three star for example, given that the star only represents the level of facilities. Additionally, lower star ratings are usually cheaper, so you can benefit from quality, reduced price accommodation if you know where to look. Whatever type of accommodation you opt for, if you are flexible enough to leave for your

vacation instantly you will benefit from good deals. Hotels often cut their prices at the last minute, on the basis that some money for a room is better than no money, and so if you're prepared to get away as soon as possible, you will find it can be really cheap, and you can still have a great time all the same.

On top of that, the internet is home to a variety of low cost airlines which run 'no frills', no ticket services. In my personal experience, I have found these airlines to be as good as their more expensive competitors, and just as efficient and comfortable. One word of caution about any airline: make sure they are equipped to handle skiing equipment. Some companies will charge a surplus for your skis, so it is important to ask before you book as to arrangements for bulky or large and fragile goods.

Another highly recommended purchase is insurance for both your equipment and yourself. Things do go wrong, on holiday as well as at home. It is important, therefore to make sure you are covered. Particularly when you are placing your equipment in an airplane hold, or when you are indulging in a dangerous sport like skiing, insurance is important for ensuring you don't end up high and dry. You can find good deals if you shop around, and it really is worth the few bucks to get that piece of mind, and actual backup in case things go wrong. In a word, it is essential. Don't leave home without it!

Skiing In Chile

If you are looking for a more exotic skiing trip, why not consider Chile? One of the world's finest skiing regions, Chile is a great place for skiing enthusiasts of any age any skill level. Why not consider Chile as an alternative skiing destination with international appeal, and pick up some of the Andean culture along the way!

One of the best resorts in my experience is the La Parva resort, located near Santiago. The La Parva resort is often underrated, billed as second to its higher

brother, Valle Nevado. However, if you are more into skiing across uninterrupted, unspoilt terrain, with more variety and depth of ski, I would most certainly recommend La Parva as the resort for you. With a total of 14 lifts, the resort is of a medium size, and is comparatively popular, although still free from the depth of tourists covering the more popular, more accessible slopes. One factor to consider is that the snow coverage is not always as consistent as with other resorts, and this may pose a problem for some skiers, although if you take the time to research the conditions before you go, you should be able to experience La Parva in all its glory.

La Parva also prides itself in a well-equipped training academy, which attracts some of Chile's best skiing talent. As well as Olympic training, they also offer public lessons, and have an excellent track record when it comes to improving performance. The friendly and helpful training staff pride themselves on their heritage, and take great pride in the condition of their slopes the quality of their training, which really shows in their instruction.

An important word of advice - it is important before setting off for Chile on your skiing trip that you ensure you have your passport in place. If you don't have a passport, or if your last passport has expired, it might be a good idea to apply early so you don't avoid disappointment. The application and issuing processes can take up to 14 weeks, so it is vital that you budget for this time allotment when booking your skiing vacation.

Similarly, South America can be a dangerous place to visit, and there have been several high profile instances of kidnap by rebel and terrorist organizations in the area. On this note, it is perhaps best to consult the internet for any government warnings which may be issued, and to keep track of current affairs, although thankfully these instances are becoming rarer in these modern times.

The fact is that snow is deep and compressed, and that leads to ideal conditions for hitting the slopes. We started out by booking some lessons. My partner had skied before, but said that because they hadn't skied for a while, they would rather do the lessons as well. The instructor was great, and really helped to give me an understanding of what was involved. I felt like I knew how to start, and stop and I felt like that gave me the necessary confidence to get started.

The instructor seemed to really understand how to teach us, and I suppose that would come with his experience. He explained to us the importance of safety on the slopes, and how you have to be aware of what the people are doing around you.

During our holiday, we had a really great time. We woke up early and hit the slopes everyday. We both had really sore legs on the first few days, but that is because we both sit behind a desk five days a week. At night time, we were able to go out for dinner, and we soon became temporary locals at a nice restaurant that overlooked the slopes. It really was great, especially the food. There were also lots of nice pubs and clubs, however we very rarely went out after our dinner: being on the slopes all day takes all the energy out of you.

If you are planning a skiing vacation then I do have a few words of warning before you decide to actually go away. Firstly, you should make sure that you are going to be in the correct physical condition to hit the slopes when you are over their. My uncle and auntie are well into their fifties and they decided to go on a skiing vacation. I never had the heart to say to them before they went, but as you can imagine it hardly the best idea, especially when my auntie suffers from heart problems. They went away and came back telling the relatives: "There is nothing to do if you don't want to ski". I found this hilarious, however they seemed to think it was perfectly reasonable.

Tremblant In Canada

Tremblant is based in Canada and has over 90 runs servicing millions of skiers each year. With 13 state-of-the-art ski lifts and a selection of choices for both snowboarders and skiers Tremblant attained its reputation through daring, varied runs catering for a selection of abilities and preferences. With its longest run being 6km long, you cannot help but picture Tremblant as the skiing capital of Canada.

Standing 2854 feet (870 meters) tall, and with snowboarding and skiing facilities on all four faces, it is no wonder the 628 acre facility is considered the home to Skiing in the area. The facility allows for natural snow between November and April however this does not set anyone back for the other months of the year. The revolutionary Avalanche system actually turns water into snow in an instant. There are 885 guns, that spray a cooling gassy chemical onto the snow and the coverage is able to not only turn water into snow in minutes, but also maintain organic snow forever. The amazing system ensures that the temperature is just right: not turning the snow to ice.

For those of you who get hungry there are also great accessible eateries available at the top of the 2854 feet mountain. Whilst most holiday makers will experience the Tremblant as experienced skiers, there are also many options available to the beginners and intermediates choosing to visit Tremblant. With over 40 beginner slopes and over 50 multi-lingual skiing instructors you really have to visit Tremblant to understand its sheer scale. Learning to ski in Tremblant is not only a great idea because of the experience of the instructors, but also because your choices are not restricted at all.

The accommodation in Tremblant is amazing, with 6 hotels all with excellent service and offering amazing luxury to their guests. In a hotel, where you see amazing views onto the massive mountain, you also see firework displays that they put on for the tourists each evening. In case that puts you off, I was assured the fireworks do not make any noise, apart from at the weekends. The amazing Tremblant skiing resort has never hosted a large event, and is firmly known for its ability to cater for tourists, however that has not stopped it, in its quest to host the 2009 open. Having placed a bid, we can all wait and see if Tremblant is successful.

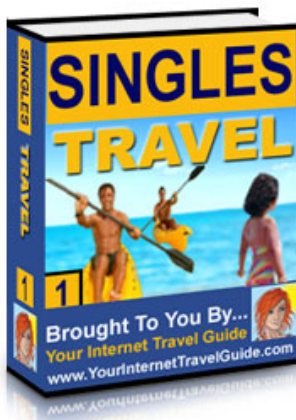
